Lost Words from our Childhood

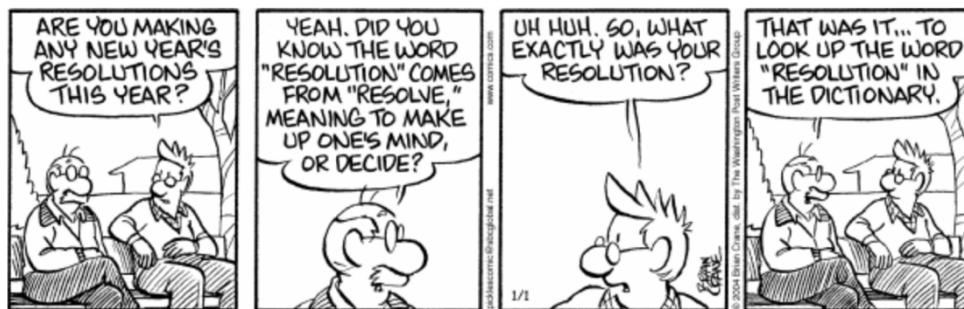
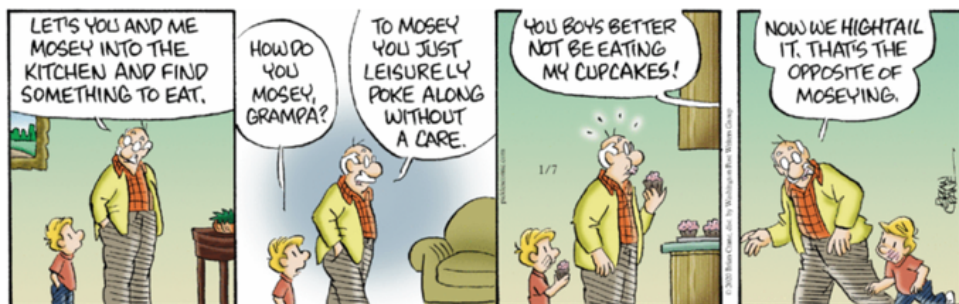

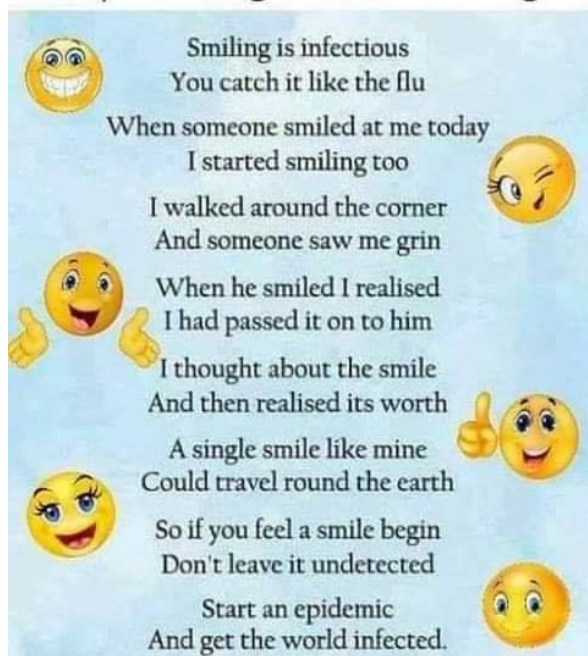
