#### Legislative Update

HB 45 (Health benefits) passed. First, it passed in the House, 53-11. Two of the 11 "no" votes came from San Juan County: Farmington's Rod Montoya (R), and Blanco/Aztec/Bloomfield's Paul Bandy (R). Kirtland/Shiprock's Anthony Allison (D) voted "yes." It next passed in the Senate, 29-11. One of the 11 "no" votes came from Farmington's Bill Sharer (R), while Blanco/Aztec/Bloomfield's Steven Neville (R) voted "yes," and Kirtland/Shiprock's Shannon Pinto (D) was excused.

<u>HB 46 (Pension benefits)</u> got tabled in the House Appropriations & Finance Committee, so it never went to the Floor for voting.

Russell Goff of NMAER said in his latest email "...we ask you to contact Governor Michele Lujan Grisham at 505 476-2200 and urge her to sign HB 45!" The bill does not become law until she signs it, and she has the power to veto. The bill will help improve the solvency of our retiree health benefits, which is in jeopardy as it stands now. Also, please send a "thank you" note to Steven Neville and Anthony Allison for voting "yes" on this bill.

#### **MINUTES OF THE SJAER EXECUTIVE BOARD: February 11, 2020**

The meeting was called to order by President Marilyn Montoya at 10:45 am. The minutes of the January meetings, as they appear on page 4 of the January YARN, were approved after a motion was made by Karen Morrison and a second by Laura Busch. The financial report, as printed on page 5 of the January YARN, was approved after a motion was made by Nancy Tyson and seconded by Karen Ransom.

COMMITTEE REPORTS. Treasurer: The numbers look good, especially with the luncheon monies balancing. Courtesy & Telephone: A get well card was sent to Marie Chavez; a sympathy card was sent to the family of Barbara Tucker. Membership: SJAER has a new member this month: Debbie Klein. Programs: A change has been made for March and April. March will be Delbert Anderson with the San Juan Jazz Society. April will be Tina White with Tee One (a golf program for youth), as well as a speaker from Farmington High School. [Editor Note: The discussion was as shown above, but since then, the programs have changed. See page 5 of this YARN for the latest programming schedule.] Legislative and Social: Once again, it's imperative that we contact our legislators while the legislation is in session. Scholarship: Three applications have been received; one is not eligible until next year. The deadline to apply is February 29. Also, the committee needs a new member to replace one leaving. Nominating Committee for next year's officers: The "table talk"/brainstorming program at last month's luncheon netted some very promising possibilities for next year's officers. Thanks to all who are willing to serve. Arrangements concerning who will do what are currently being discussed. In the meantime, two Board Member Chairs are now open: Scholarship Committee Chair and Legislative Chair.

OTHER BUSINESS. 1) Concerning snow days on our meeting days, members should check the local media to see what Farmington schools are doing. If the snow requires only a 2-hour delay, we will meet, but the meeting will be delayed 30 minutes (membership to arrive at noon) to allow time for the students/staff to prepare our lunch. If FMS has closed schools for the entire day on our Tuesday luncheon/meeting date, we will meet on the following day, Wednesday, at our regular time. The meals will have already been purchased by FMS, so will be freshly made the next day for our lunch. If any members signed up for Tuesday and can't make it Wednesday, their meals will be packaged up and sold for \$10.00 to members present, if possible. 2) It was agreed that the suggested practice for our organization is that if a member invites a guest to the luncheon/meeting, that member should pay for their guest. SJAER has no money in the budget to reimburse the member or guest for lunch. 3) Karen Morrison presented the newly printed postcards that will be used to invite people to become members of SJAER. 4) The lottery drawing for next month's free lunch was #9 on the roster: Pam Coy.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:12 am with a motion by Joan Lewis and a second by Laura Busch.

He said, "If you don't let them [the legislators] know, don't kid yourself that they will put it [the money] elsewhere." He added, "[Your] silence does not mean 'yes;' silence means you don't care."

Marilyn announced that Rod Conover's Legislative Chair position on the SJAER Board is open for next year. Also, the Scholarship Committee will need two positions next year: a new member and a new Chair. Please consider accepting one of these interesting and rewarding positions. Contact Rod, Joan, or Marilyn for more information. The Scholarship Committee has received two eligible applications for the SJAER scholarship that is awarded each year. Evidently, a few members were not aware that SJAER collects donations each month. Two baskets are on the sign-in table as you pay for your meal. One is for the scholarship donations, and one is to collect money for ECHO food bank's Backpack for Kids program.

The policy for snow days was announced. Please see the policy as stated above in the minutes of the Board Meeting. The free lunch for March goes to Pam Coy.

A delicious meal of fresh salad, chicken cacciatore and carrot cake was served by the Court St. Catering/CATE Center students.
