The meeting was called to order by President Marilyn Montoya at 10:50. The minutes of the October meeting, as they appeared on pages 4 and 5 of the November YARN, were approved after a motion to do so was made by Karen Ransom and a second by Nancy Tyson. Additionally, the treasurer's report for October as shown on page 3 of the November YARN was approved after a motion by Nancy Tyson and a second by Rod Conover.

Caroline McDonald reported get-well-cards were sent to Emma Weaver and Marilyn Montoya. (Marilyn was presiding over the meeting and looking terrific, so the card must have aided in her recovery.) Sympathy cards were sent to the families of Ray Horvath, Madeliene Coffey, and Mr. and Mrs. Bill Cawood.

Phyllis reported that from all the emails sent out to new county retirees (except no list was ever obtained from CCSD), there has not been any new members acquired. The SJAER booth manned by Phyllis and Laura (they were the go-getters) had several persons stop by; however, no new members were recruited.

Joan Lewis reported the scholarship applications had been given to Dr. Vitali, who is in charge of student teachers through UNM. As of yet, no applications have been received.

These specially trained dogs are taken to hospital waiting rooms, nursing homes, schools, and wherever there is a need for the comfort of a loving dog. She said often times troubled students will talk or read to a dog whereas they may be reluctant to interact with a human. *Pet Pals* also works with the Boys and Girls Club.

Another delicious meal was served by the students of Court Street Catering. It's a pleasure to be giving these students "on-the-job" training.
