- 6. Changes Ed Retirement Board Membership (SB303)-Passed
- 7. Educational Retirees Returning to Work (SB390)-Died in Committee
- 8. GRT & Permanent Fund for LEDA Projects (HB11)-Passed
- 9. Cannabis Regulations Act (HB12)-Died in Committee; Passed in Special Session
- 10. <u>Daylight Savings Time (SB102)</u>-Died in Committee


