## **SJAER Meetings**



The state nominates schools that have show success in closing the learning gap over a period of 3-5 years and the scoring for their educational plan. They created a supportive environment where all students experience success: academically, emotionally, and socially. She also gave credit to standards-based system and the common core curriculum. Most important is the fact that every child is the responsibility of all the staff. It takes teamwork. Ladera is featured in an audio podcast at <a href="https://nationalblueribbonschools.ed.gov/audio-overcoming-challenges-to-close-the-achievement-gap/">https://nationalblueribbonschools.ed.gov/audio-overcoming-challenges-to-close-the-achievement-gap/</a>. Phyllis received the award in Washington DC. The students wore blue ribbons in recognition of their part in reaching this goal.
- ➤ Aztec's Painted Pianos: The painted pianos project combines art and music. May 8<sup>th</sup> is the kick off with piano concerts from noon to 6:00 pm. There will be sidewalk concerts throughout the season May 8 October 2. Pianos in the Park concert will be from 2:00-6:00 on July 17. #### **Letter from NMAER - Our State Association**

April 27, 2021

To: NMAER Unit Presidents From: Michael Torrez, President H. Russell Goff, Executive Director

On Thursday, April 8, 2021, the NMAER Executive Board held its regularly scheduled meeting virtually to review recommendations from the Executive Committee on how to return safely to some form of normalcy in a time that is foreign to all of us. The following recommendations were approved by Executive Board to help guide NMAER in 2021:

- NMAER Units and Committees are urged to consider using a virtual platform until they can meet safely in person. The NMAER State Office and AMBA representatives have been providing assistance and Zoom training to Units wanting to meet virtually.
- The NMAER Scholarship program will be postponed for 2021. In its place NMAER will donate \$2000 to the Dr. Karen Trujillo Scholarship Fund for new teachers at NMSU. Dr.

Trujillo is the former Superintendent of the Las Cruces Public Schools who died tragically earlier this year.

- The in-person State Convention scheduled for September 2021 in Curry County will be POSTPONED and, in its place, a virtual mini-Conference hosted by the State Office will be scheduled for September 24, 2021. More information on this conference will be available in the summer newsletter.
- The Curry (Clovis) County AER has agreed to host the in-person NMAER State Convention in September 2022.
- The Delegate Assembly vote on the 2021 budget, slate of officers and any amendments will be by a mail-in ballot to each delegate. The new officers, budget and any amendments for 2022 will also be elected by a mail-in ballot. The new officers for 2022 will be sworn in during the virtual mini-Conference on September 24, 2021. In May, each Unit will receive a letter from the NMAER State Office providing instructions and the number of delegates who will be allowed to vote for each Unit.
- The Community Service hours and the Outstanding Unit Member programs will be continuing in 2021 with some alterations.
- a. Community Service Hours: The Executive Board approved a September 1, 2020 through August 2021 period of time to collect volunteer hours and will use only one category of Community Service under which all service hours will be compiled. Results from these programs will be announced in the autumn Newsletter. Linda Carr at 575 442-1801 or lcarr9@hotmail.com will be communicating with you regarding Community Service Hours.
- b. Outstanding Unit Member. Pauline Rindone at 505 603-2259 or polarr1964@hotmail.com will be communicating with you regarding the Outstanding Unit Member and asking for your selection of an Outstanding Unit Member to be sent to her by June 18, 2021.
- NMAER will continue to provide three Newsletters in April, August and October.
- NMAER will continue to recruit new members. This year's focus will be on recruiting Associate members. We also hope to send the names of retirees and the district that they retire from to each Unit. The information provided will not include the address of the retiree. As I indicated during our first virtual Conference on Friday, April 9, 2021, this was our first attempt to hold such a conference and it turned out to be very successful. The theme for the Conference was "A Return to Some Form of Normalcy." We had sixteen units and members of the NMAER Executive Board represented in the Conference with a total attendance of 36.

We are thankful that so many were able to join us and support this Unit Presidents Conference.
