A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

March 2022

My heart has been heavy these past days when I think about and watch the news stories about the people of Ukraine. This horrific event of warfare, invasion, injury and death has me thinking about the effects of grief and grieving. A heavy topic for sure, but one conversation/discussion we need to have.

Grief doesn't have to be the loss of a loved one...it can be the loss of anything held dear. It is incredibly complex and non-linear, according to Rabbi Steve Leder in his book, "The Beauty of What Remains: How Our Greatest Fear Becomes Our Greatest Gift."

Every individual experiences and expresses death and grief differently and it isn't limited exclusively to feelings of sadness. Leder allows there can be beauty, joy, and big, big love that can sit alongside those feelings of loss. We just need to learn how to hold all of those feelings at the same time. It's in talking about death and dying, bringing the conversation into the light, that we actually ease the suffering of those grieving, because silence isolates. You would think with death being universally inevitable, we'd be more comfortable talking about the topic. But sadly, we still avoid it.

In the first two months of 2022, we have lost 12 educator colleagues. (Thanks Trish Murphy for continuing to provide the information for the YARN "In Memoriam" notice.) So often people apologize (in hindsight) for the avoidance of conversation because they didn't know what to say. So for starters, reach out and say something, anything, without expectation. Just let them know you are thinking about them. It can be as simple as "I'm so sorry. I have no words. I just want you to know I'm here and thinking of you often."

Rabbi Leder also advises to avoid asking "How can I help?" and just telling what you are going to do to help...drop off meals, mow their lawn, shovel snow, take their dog for a walk, etc. The grieving person is not likely in a place to make decisions and you don't want to burden them. Then make a note on your calendar to check back regularly, because after the initial barrage of support, life gets quiet, and grievers can feel forgotten.

Continued prayers for the people of Ukraine and our own members who have suffered the death of a loved one this year. We see you. Support you. Hold you fast in our hearts.




SJAER-GENERAL MEETING 2-8-22 11:30 AM at No Worries


