A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

April 2022

So, it's April and you know what that means...the IRS is out to get you!! If the IRS don't get you, then the crazy wind is gonna blow you away! If the crazy winds don't blow you away, then maybe you'll go stir crazy because we're still mostly sheltering in place to avoid the Covid germs! And, to avoid the covid germs, we're still wearing masks even though the Governor lifted the mask policy for most public places.

Frankly I've noticed massive confusion about mask wearing more in the last few weeks than ever before. When (and if) you go out to eat at a favorite local restaurant, have a drink at your local liquor/beer establishment, or a cuppa joe at your nearby coffee place, * you may remove your mask to eat and drink, while others still sit at their table masked-up until the actual food or drink hits the table. First greetings from me to others in the locker room usually start with "I'm so tired this morning." Other "mermaids" often agree with that sentiment. We haven't even got into the water to start exercising and we are tired. This fatigue isn't just physical It's also mental and emotional. We are tired of being tired. Tired of the stress and strain from the pandemic and it's confinements.

The best way, in my opinion to get rid of this fatigue is to get outside, breathe fresh air, walk the neighborhood or a nearby park or Riverwalk. Start doing the things we used to do that bring us joy...and be joyful. If music gives you joy, plan to attend the Caliente Choir concert, Tuesday the 19th, 7pm, First Presbyterian Church on Dustin. \$10 at the door. It may kickstart your joy! Oh, happy day!



Volunteers are priceless, but NMAER puts a price on our heads anyway! The volunteer hours that we submit to the State gets converted into a cash amount had someone actually hired us for that service. Each year New Mexico retired educational employees contribute multi-million dollars' worth of services to our communities. One of NMAER's objectives is to encourage volunteerism among the members. So, please help us contribute to their Statewide objective. This can be done 2 ways: simply report your hours when you sign in at our local lunch meeting, or report your hours online to Trish Murphy at trishshsh@live.com

What do you report? Just about anything! Work in any service organization, church, school, political party, government agency, or business counts. Private volunteer work with friends, neighbors and family counts – such as making meals for shut-ins, driving disabled people to do their errands, sending greeting cards to nursing homes, childcare, tutoring, pet sitting, lawn care, or anything you do for free that someone would otherwise pay for.

When do you report? You can report monthly, at the very end of the year, or any time in between. The year starts September 2021 and ends August 2022. You may submit your hours retrospectively -- just don't duplicate your hours once you've submitted them once. Deadline to get the hours in will be August 1st (so estimate your August hours in advance.)

It's a "win/win" situation! When you volunteer, you help other people, but you also help yourself! Wes Moss, author of What the Happiest Retirees Know, launched multiple studies of over 2000 retirees. Under the "social data" category, he said that the happiest retiree had 4 core pursuits: travel, activities with their kids and grandkids, participating in hobbies or sports, and (quote) "by far, number one, VOLUNTEERING." Chances are, if you volunteer, you are a happy person!

So far this year, we SJAER members have reported **2027** volunteer hours. However, we suspect that there are many more people out there who volunteer, and don't report. So please take time out of your busy schedule and let us know, ok?


