HOSPITAL CORPORATION REPORT – by Jim Convers

The San Juan Regional Medical Center Hospital Corporation held its quarterly meeting on Wednesday, January 25,2023 at the Farmington Civic Center. Sam Gonzales Board Chair conducted the meeting. He announced that the search for a new CEO is in the final stages with two finalists. A decision is expected soon.

The new member application of the BYU Alumni Association was approved.

Sam Gonzales was reappointed for a 3 year term. Former Board member Sherry Galloway was honored for many years of service to the Board.

The financial report indicated a stable picture. Medical malpractice insurance needs have been addressed. The Investment Committee continues to evaluate how best to invest the hospital equity gains. The Hospital has 35 million in assets and 238 days of cash on hand.

The newly remodeled Pediatrics Unit is now open. The Heart Center offers the world's smallest pacemaker. The Hospital has improved capabilities to screen for colon cancer by AI technology.

Nurses Dilan Jones, Benjamin Stamets ad Rebekah Stamets received the DAISY award. Chief of Staff Dr. Daniel Mannus reported on new staff at the Hospital

The Auxiliary reported they had recruited 31 total volunteers in 2022. Twenty-two were teen volunteers. The Auxiliary earned \$1942 at the Uniform Kingdom sale. Pet therapy lost Maya, one of the pet volunteers. The Riley Men's Health Fund was able to help 156 men with \$451,107 in medical bills. related medical bills.

Senior Scams – Tips to Prevent Fraud

Provided for the YARN by Marilyn who got hacked with a "gift card" scam! If someone calls you, don't buy any gift cards for Marilyn!

General Tips to Prevent Fraud

- Never give out personal information to anyone by phone, mail, or internet. Never respond to an offer that you do not understand
- Ask for invoices in writing and pay only when you have eceived a performed service
- Shred credit card receipts and statements before throwing them in the trash. Close unsued credit card or bank accounts.

Healthcare and Health Insurance Fraud

- Do not sign blank isurance forms or give blanket authorizations.
- Do not do business with telephone or door-to-door salespeople.
- Do not give your Medicare or health insurance information to just anyone.
- Check with your doctor if a prescription looks suspicious or has adverse side effects,

Investment and Reverse Mortgage Scams

- Do not respond to unsolicited requests. Do not sign any documents from unsolicited persons
- Be wary of anyone offering unusually high interest or dividends.

Funeral and Cemetery Fraud

- Don't let the salespeople pressure you into immediate purchases.
- Understand contract terms, basic fees, and extra services.

Telemarketing Fraud

- Hang up if the caller offers something free or deeply discounted, or if they say you must act immediately.
- Don't buy from unknown companies.
- Don't pay for anything until you receive it.

Charity Scams

- Do not disclose any personal or financial information.
- Learn about charities before you give. Both charitynavigator.org and charitywatch.org are good resources.
