
Nonperishable, easy fix, microwavable food items, hygiene items, feminine products, etc. are needed to support these students and keep them in school. Let's help them out! See photo below.

Legislative Update

Russell Goff has been keeping us appraised of all the goings on at the Round House, but here are a few that deal specifically with education.

- >SM 16, STUDY DEFINED CONTRIBUTION PENSION, sponsored by Sen Bill Tallman resurfaced twice on the Senate Rules Committee agenda. In both occasions the memorial was not heard. On Friday, after our lobbyists, myself and others met with the Senator he agreed to pull the legislation. We will continue to watch to be sure it doesn't resurface.
- > SB 20a, CHANGES TO ERB, sponsored by Sen Gay Kernan. This bill would allow eligible employees of the Southeast New Mexico College in Carlsbad to participate in the Alternative Retirement Plan. SB 20 received a DO PASS in House Labor and Senate Finance Committee. It passed the Senate floor on a 34-0 vote and awaits a hearing in House Labor on March 7, 2023. SUPPORT
- > HB 189a, EDUCATIONAL RETIREMENT CHANGES, sponsored by Rep Cathyrnn Brown. This is the companion bill to SB 20. This week HB 189 was heard in House Education Committee and amended to remove section one having to do with the extension of contracts. HB 189a received a DO PASS in the House Education Committee and the House Appropriations Committee. This bill awaits a hearing on the House floor. SUPPORT
- > SB 492, EDUCATIONAL RETURN TO WORK CHANGES, sponsored by Sen George Munoz. This bill would extend the new 90-day layout law, passed in 2022, from a 36-month sunset to 60-months. SB 492 received a unanimous DO PASS in Senate Education Committee and is scheduled to be heard in the Senate Finance Committee on March 6, 2023. SUPPORT
- > **SB 193, RETIREE HEALTH CARE AUTHORITY, sponsored by Sen Mimi Stewart. This is the companion bill to SB 150. SB 193 was heard in the Senate Health & Public Affairs Committee and received a DO PASS on a 6-0 vote. It awaits a hearing in the Senate Finance Committee. SUPPORT-HIGH PRIORITY.
- >HB 126, SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS, sponsored by Rep G. Andres Romero & T. Ryan Lane. This bill removes Algebra II and a foreign language from graduation requirements for students entering the ninth grade in the 2024-25 school year and drops the number of credits needed for graduation from 24 to 22 units. HB 126 received a DO PASS in the House Commerce & Economic Development Committee and in the House Education Committee. This bill was approved on the House floor on a 64-3 vote. It was given a DO PASS in Senate Education and awaits a hearing on the Senate floor.
