

Final Legislative update from Russell Goff

TOTAL BILLS, MEMORIALS & RESOLUTIONS INTRODUCED, INCLUDING DUMMY BILLS:1294

TOTAL BILLS PASSED IN BOTH CHAMBERS: 387

TOTAL BILLS SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR TO DATE: 26

Here are some key highlights of the session:

- > Tax package that includes rebates of \$500 per taxpayer.
- > Approval of Statewide Capital Outlay projects for near \$1.2 billion.
- > Raise max possible potential pension benefit for public employees.
- > Automatic voter registration when obtaining a Driver's license.
- > Restore felons' right to vote when they leave incarceration.
- > Legislation that makes it a crime to fail to store firearms out of children's reach.
- > Revise medical malpractice law to assist independent clinics.
- > Prohibit life sentences without the possibility of parole for juveniles.
- > Offer free lunch for all K-12 students.
- > Increase wages of teacher assistants from \$12,000 to \$25,000.
- > Raise required instructional time to 1140 hours.
- > Revise high school graduations requirements.
- > Make Election DAY a school holiday.
- > Provide teachers a 5% raise plus an additional 1% to offset health care costs.

- > HB 304, PUBLIC EMPLOYEE RETIREMENT NEEDS TRUST, sponsored by Rep Chasey, Rep Thompson, Rep Lujan, Rep Ortiz y Pino & Sen Stewart. SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR.
- > HB 2 & 3, GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR 2023sponsored by Rep Nathan Small and Rep Meredith Dixon. SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR.
- > SB 16, CREATE HEALTH CARE AUTORITY DEPARTMENT, sponsored by Sen Elizabeth Stefanics & Representative Elizabeth Thompson.

THE GOVERNOR HAS UNTIL FRIDAY, APRIL 7 AT NOON TO SIGN BILLS OR THEY ARE POCKET VOTED.
