# SAN JUAN REGIONAL MEDICAL CENTER CORPORATION REPORT WEDNESDAY, JULY 26, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM by chairman Sam Gonzales.

Dr. Philip Ernest and Meghan Ritz, PA discussed the Metabolic and Bariatric Institute. This is dealing with surgery to address being overweight and obese. In the US 63.2% of Americans are overweight or obese. 70% of New Mexicans and 81.5% of San Juan County residents are overweight or obese. This is a new program that has only been operating about 3 months. There may be issues with insurance coverage which have to be resolved. They use the Da Vinci Robotic Platform. This can reduce hypertension, Diabetes, Sleep Apnea, and GERD.

The hospital has received a grant to develop primary care physicians in our community. San Juan Health Partners Gastroenterology has moved to 630 West Maple Street.

SJRMC has been honored for Heart Attack Care. The Mission Lifeline program helps reduce barriers to treatment from when 911 is called to EMS transport, treatment and discharge.

Jason Aikele, a nurse in the Cardiac Cath Lab and Jeny Okmura, ICU nurse, have received the DAISY awards. Recipients of the Suzanne Smith Nursing Excellence Awards are as follows: Victoria Atencio—emergency Department, Miranda Herrera, Connie Grijalva, Emergency Department, and Sonja Crum—Childbirth Unit.

The Hospital has course offerings. They include Childbirth Education Weekend Intensive Course, Labor and Pain Management and Gearing Up for New Parents.

The Hospital continues to maintain a strong financial status. New Medical Staff include the following; Janet Gorhan—Certified Nurse Practitioner, Zachary Haynes – Physician Assistant, J. Angela Miller – Doctor of Osteopathy, Benedette Ogindo – Certified Nurse Practitioner, Christopher Rectmeier – Certified Nurse Anesthesia, Drew Swasey MD – Anesthesiology

The Auxiliary recruited 30 volunteers in 2023. Seventeen are teen volunteers and 13 are adults. There are a total of 49 active volunteers.

As of June 30, the Cathy Lincoln Cancer Fund had helped 64 women. The Riley Men's Health fund had helped 92 men.
